The first item of business to come before the meeting was the matter of the minutes of the July 8, 2025 meeting. After review:

Next, the Engineer's Report was submitted, the written portions of which are included in the records of the District. An outline of the content is attached hereto. Monitoring of the Mitigation Area plantings by Moore Biological was completed. Irrigation system repair and some supplemental planting is required. Closing out the funding of the EIP Project is pending a release of retention for phases I & II in the amount of \$784,235.00. Meritage Homes seepage berm along dryland levee is complete. Counsel to prepare easement for signature by Meritage Homes. Manteca Storm Drain Improvement project has all necessary approvals from DWR. RD 17 is awaiting plans for review and resolution with Manteca. Roadway damage to entrance to Haven Acres is planned for repair. Plan review for new development at 721 Carolyn Weston Blvd discovered a conflict with levee maintenance and comments were submitted to the developer and City of Stockton.

Next, the Superintendent reported that rodent activity was under control. Maintenance of locked gates and homeless camps are continuing problems. Habitat irrigation system had some broken lines and apparent animal damage.

Thereafter there being no further business to come before the meeting the meeting was adjourned.

AND THE BUDGET ACT OF 2022**

Amendment Number 7 to the Agreement, entered into by and between the State of California, acting by and through the Department of Water Resources, herein referred to as the "State" and the Reclamation District 17, a reclamation district in the County of San Joaquin, State of California, duly organized, existing, and acting pursuant to the laws thereof, herein referred to as the "Funding Recipient," which parties do hereby agree as follows:

- A. This Amendment will modify STD 213A, Amendment 6, Paragraph 2, of the subject Funding Agreement to extend the length of the agreement by 24 months. The termination date is extended from December 31, 2025, to December 31, 2027. The extended term of the agreement is from January 15, 2010, to December 31, 2027.
- B. All other terms and conditions of Agreement # 4600008720, including Amendments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 shall remain the same.

RESOLVED, the work described below is a necessary part of the ongoing project to maintain the existing levees and within one or more of the following exemptions under the California Environmental Quality Act: California Code of Regulations Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15261(a) Ongoing Project; Section 15269(a) Emergency Projects; Section 15301 Existing Facilities (Class I) and Section 15302 (Class2) (b) and (c).

- 1) All repair of wave wash and erosion protection.
- 2) All levee crown rehabilitation which is not in excess of the 100-year flood elevation plus 2 feet as adjusted for sea level rise.
- 3) All levee section rehabilitation including adding material to back slopes, construction of toe berms, seepage berms, drains and other measures to control seepage exit gradients to less than 0.5.
- 4) All work included in FMAP Maintenance Applications.
- 5) All emergency flood fight, repair and restoration work.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proposed work will not have a material adverse effect upon the environment and does not constitute an exception to the exemptions of the California Environmental Quality Act.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the District Engineer, Secretary, President, or any Trustee is authorized to prepare and file with the County Clerk of the County or Counties in which the work is to be performed, a "Notice of Exemption" pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15062.

This resolution shall constitute continuing authority until revoked by subsequent action of the Board of Trustees.
